





## PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING



Step Up was honored to host Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg (pictured second from right, along with Tod Lipka, President & CEO; Emily James, Director of SA 4

Clinical Programs; John Watson, Step Up member; and Aaron Criswell, newly appointed Chief Housing Development Officer). Steinberg is interested in motel conversions, an issue that Step Up is a leader in with five motels in the process of conversion for Veterans experiencing homelessness and three conversions in its current portfolio.

Mayor Steinberg, co-chair of the Governor's Task Force on Homelessness, was the co-author of the 2006 Mental Health Services Act, which has yielded billions of dollars in funding for mental health across the state and is the reason why Step Up has Full-Service Partnership (FSP) programs in Los Angeles and San Bernardino County, our client run center at Second Street, and the drop-in center at Daniel's Place.

## **WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT**



Les Jones, (pictured on left), former Step Up member and now full-time staff, is the founder of Step Up's Computer Learning Center. He has been teaching and helping others as they transition out of homelessness since 2014. Thanks in part

to Spectrum's 2018 Digital Education Grant, Les has expanded his reach to include the Veterans in Bldg 209 on the West L.A. VA campus. The Veterans have access to Acer Chromebooks, "the computer of the future," says Jones.

The atmosphere created by Jones is one of comradery and generosity, "You learn something, you teach something." Says resident William K. (pictured on right), "Les has created a safe space for us. At 62, I overcame the resistance to learn and discovered it's never too late to grow. For that, I am thankful."

## A SENSE OF BELONGING



Growing up in Moreno Valley was not easy for 26 yearold Sarah W. (pictured). Her life was dictated by domestic violence, depression, and anxiety. Her mother was not stable, her father was prone to violence, and her grandmother was experiencing schizophrenia. Couch-surfing with her mother to escape the violence at home, bullied at school for being overweight, and feeling suicidal was the norm for Sarah.

After graduating from high school, Sarah went to beauty school but had to drop out due to a lack of

funds. Tired of the hostility from her mother's family, Sarah moved into a shelter on her own. It was there she was given the information for Michael's Village. Sarah has lived at Michael's Village for the past three years. She now attends Los Angeles Trade School for Estheticians. Her relationship with her father is a work in progress and Sarah looks forward to the day she can take care of her mom. Sarah sums up her life, "It's ok to cry as long as you don't give up."
