

There is a strong relationship between healthcare, housing, and new opportunities. All Step Up members have access to opportunities for meaningful employment such as: facilities maintenance; receptionist duties; clerical support; food service; restaurant kitchen operations; pre-vocational training, techniques for job interviews; work adjustment; employment preparation; and job placement. Hands-on experiences in paid positions include word processing, data entry, and retail associate work.
