The #1 requested supportive service...







Like-minded service providers, developers, investers, and jurisdictional leaders gathered to bring supportive housing to scale.

The Housing First Partners Conference was held at the Westin Bonaventure Hotel in Los Angeles March 22-25. "Taking Housing First to Scale". An evidence-based model, Housing First provides housing as quickly as possible and then provides a variety of support services to promote housing stability and individual well-being as needed. It has the benefit of being consistent with what most people experiencing homelessness want and seek help to achieve. The international conference, attended by 800 participants from around the globe, explored the expansion of the Housing First model, how the model is currently being implemented in the United States and abroad, and how to scale the many more units needed to END chronic homelessness. The office of 3rd District County Supervisor Sheila Kuehl awarded a \$20,000 grant through its Food For the Soul program in support of Step Up's Rooftop Urban Garden. The award funds the position of Gerardo Gutierrez (above left) whose duties include: ordering the aeroponic and maintenance supplies; scheduling and managing the aeroponic team; propagating the plants; giving tours; fixing any problems that may arise; and managing within the budget and in compliance with OSHA and Safety. Fresh garden produce from the aeroponic gardens is part of the daily meals served for Step Up on Vine residents. Tenants may also make special arrangements with Gerardo and the Vocational Team to pick up produce from the Rooftop Urban Garden for use in their own units in the Platinum LEED building.
