Step Up's nationally recognized approach to Housing First and mental health recovery services contributed to its expansion into San Bernardino in October 2016, and into Riverside in a few short months.

Step Up is also now providing supportive services in Orange County for individuals formerly experiencing homelessness now residing in apartments in Anaheim developed by its partner Jamboree Housing (shown above). Step Up and Jamboree will also soon be partnering again to help end homelessness for 75 Veterans in Jamboree's housing development (below) located in Santa Ana expected to open Fall 2019.



Step Up is also in partnership with Mercy House in Orange County to end homelessness for 10 households.

On Valentine's Day, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors approved a \$900,000 grant for Step Up to enhance its services for Transition Age Youth (TAY) in Hollywood.

This award, through the County's Community Development Commission, will allow Step Up to serve and house up to 25 additional young adults experiencing homelessness in Hollywood as well as increase vocational and educational opportunities geared toward young adults unique needs and to help them achieve their self-determined goals.

Intensive street outreach and engagement is at the heart of Step Up's model of meeting individuals 'right where they are.'

Step Up's Mobile Integrated Team (MIT) is comprised of a Licensed Clinical Social Worker, a Licensed Vocational Nurse, a Peer Service Coordinator, and a Psychiatrist. The MIT also meets privately with individuals every Thursday at the County Library in West Hollywood. "We're enthusiastic about our efforts and results in the community so far," said Jill Drenth, Program Manager with Step Up's WeHo MIT. "It's very enjoyable working collaboratively with other local service providers as well." The MIT goal is to end chronic homelessness for 10 households in the City of West Hollywood by September of 2017.
